NEW ADDITION TO THE LIBRARY

We would like to express our sincere thanks to Museum Curator Margie and her volunteer staff for sympathetically restoring a nineteenth century ex-Museum stock display cabinet and donating it to the Library.



The Toodyay cabinet is proudly placed near the main entrance of the Library and at present displaying a variety of ANZAC and Australian War memorabilia including; background information, photographs and a nurse apron belonging to a Voluntary Aid Detachment nurse.

VAD's were established during the first world war by the Australian Red Cross and the Order of St John. Each nurse received instruction in first aid and home nursing. During the Second World War VAD's received further training and worked alongside doctors and nurses providing assistance with first aid plus comfort and support to wounded soldiers returning from battle.

Other items on display include a Royal Army Medial Corp Training Book, a sample of field dressing used in the Second World War plus a RAAF small kit pouch, Army sewing kit, salt book and tobacco tin. The tobacco tin may have been part of a comforts package that would have been provided by the First World War Australian Comforts Fund; a local women's group who

provided soldiers with tobacco plus a few other home comforts to supplement their soldier rations.

Also on display is a life size cut of Private George Edward Chitty from the 28th Australian Infantry Battalion wounded in France during the First World War.

Similar cabinets of the same era may be found at the WA museum in Fremantle housing historical artefacts.

PROPOSED RENEWAL OF EXTRACTIVE INDUSTRY LICENCE (GRAVEL) LOT 3 (NO. 826) CLACKLINE TOODYAY ROAD, HODDY'S WELL

The Shire of Toodyay has received an application from Vernice Pty Ltd for an extractive industry at Lot 3 (No. 826) Clackline Toodyay Road, Hoddy's Well.

The applicant is seeking approval to renew an existing extractive industry licence. It is expected that an average of 12,000m³ of gravel is to be excavated per year. This will be conducted within a combined area (existing operations and proposed new areas) of 18.6 hectares. The anticipated duration of the extraction program is approximately 10 years.

Your views on the proposed extractive industry are encouraged and welcomed.

Submissions on the proposed development may be addressed in writing and lodged with the Chief Executive Officer, Shire of Toodyay, PO Box 96 Toodyay 6566, by 4.00pm on Tuesday 14 July 2015.

Bedstraw is a rare plant in UK and US but a real pest in Australia

THE THREE-HORNED bedstraw (Galium tricornutum) had a recent Department of Agriculture and Food fact sheet published about it.

It is a threat to both bushland and agriculture in WA and its presence needs to be reported to the department at the Pest and Diseases Information Service.

Three-horned bedstraw is a member of the coffee family of plants and is also known as rough corn bedstraw, rough fruit bedstraw and corn cleavers.

Parts of the UK and the US have declared it to be a rare plant and they are working to prevent it from being wiped out.

However, it is widespread across most of Europe, North Africa and South Asia, as well as in Australia, Canary Islands, Mauritius, and parts of South and North America.

The department is concerned because it is a major crop weed in south-east Australia.

Conditions are suitable in south-west WA for its establishment and, according to Florabase, it has already been reported in the local government areas of Boddington, Cranbrook, Merredin and Plantagenet.

Three-horned bedstraw is a competitive climbing plant that forms dense masses of vegetation in crops, wasteland and along fence-lines.

There are more control options when it is growing in cereal crops than when it is growing in legumes, pulses or canola.

The seed contaminates canola seed and the small hooked stems on the seed make it difficult to remove when using conventional seed cleaning equipment.

Three-horned bedstraw plants have weak branched stems up to 1.5m long.



These stems are straggly, scrambling or climbing and they have a sticky sensation caused by the numerous hooked prickles on the stem and leaves.

They are square in cross section and are usually hollow.

There are tiny backward-pointed hooked spines around all edges of the stem.

The leaves form in circular patterns around the stems in groups of six to eight.

They have no stalk, and are also covered in hairs and backward-facing prickles.

The three-horned bedstraw has very small white flowers (about 2mm across) which are found in groups of three, on little stalks which are also covered in backward-pointing prickles

The seeds of the three-horned bedstraw are about the same size as the canola seed.

Three-horned bedstraw is an annual plant which germinates in late autumn to early spring and its seed is spread by wind, water, plant parts or people and animals.

Of great concern in WA is how easily it can be spread by grain movement and agricultural machinery such as harvesters.

The seed of the three-horned bedstraw can survive three to five years in the soil, but even longer in non-wetting soils such as those characteristic in WA.

While it prefers heavier alkaline soils, its world distribution suggests it's very flexible in its growth requirements.

The department wants the public to keep a lookout for this potentially economically damaging weed.

Control methods can be found at agric. wa.gov.au/herbicides/three-horned-bedstraw-control, but it is very important to report its presence before controlling it.

Take control of anxiety before it gets a total grip on you

ANXIETY is an umbrella term for feelings of fear, nervousness, apprehensiveness or worry such as negative thoughts and seeing potential threats where they don't exist.

Everybody gets anxious at times and some anxiety actually helps us to function well but anxiety can become a problem when:

- it happens too often;
- it goes on for a long time, or
- it stops us from doing things that we want to do

Symptoms can be psychological (feeling frequently worried, tired, irritable and weepy with difficulty concentrating) and/or physical (including rapid breathing, rising blood pressure and pounding heart, a sense of restlessness or feeling on edge, muscle tension, sleep disturbance and nausea/sickness).

There is no single cause for anxiety but several factors may contribute to it.

Brain chemistry – most strongly implicated here are imbalances of serotonin and dopamine that regulate thought and feeling – contributes to feeling depressed and anxious.

Heredity – anxiety disorders run in families

Children are at higher risk if parents have an anxiety disorder.

Life experience – any distressing or traumatic experience may cause anxiety.

Exhaustion and certain medications can also be triggers.

Drug use – stimulant drugs such as amphetamines and caffeine can trigger anxiety.

Prolonged amphetamine use can cause feelings of panic and anxiety that last for years after the drug is stopped.

Some tips that may help you deal with your anxiety include the following.

Self-awareness – identify the symptoms early.

Ask yourself "what is making me feel this way?"

You may be able to change the, anxiety-making circumstances but, if not, you can deal with it better if you acknowledge it.

Interpret it positively –why are you anxious about a situation?

A little anxiety is a good thing, too much is damaging, but too little can mean you may not perform to your best ability.

Diet – the gut flora can get out of balance so try using more probiotics and omega3 foods

Research has shown maintaining a balanced diet can reduce anxiety symptoms.

Exercise boosts levels of vital brain chemicals like serotonin, dopamine and norepinephrine that may reduce stress and anxiety.

Relaxation and meditation programs – can help reduce stress, anxiety and depression.

You can find many resources for these online e.g. progressive muscle relaxation.

Therapy – there are some good programs that are offered by psychologists/ counsellors that help to re-program those unhelpful and negative ways of thinking that underpin anxiety.

Situations, or life events, can come from many places including relationship issues, financial burden, physical health, trauma, or just dealing with difficult times.

As these situations develop we need to take steps to reduce anxiety for ourselves and for those close to us.

Remember, before it all gets too much, talk to a mate.

Baa baa bleating frog likes granite

THE BLEATING or Granite Frog. Interestingly many of the frogs found around our shire have a common name relating to its call as was the Humming Frog in the June edition.

The Bleating Frog (Crinia pseudinsignifera) has a 'baa, baa, baa' call, thus its name.

It is also known as the Granite Frog with its general association with granitic areas.

The Bleating Frog 25mm SVL (snout vent

length) female is slightly larger than the male. Both are very small creatures.

However, although small in size, it has an audible call from within its covered area.

Mating takes place in the winter months with eggs laid singly in damp, to waterlogged soil beneath cover.

The eggs take up to 130 days to undergo metamorphosis which is the transformation from the larva to the adult which is the egg to the frog.

The Bleating Frog's body colour varies from grey, brown or black and there may be a dark triangular patch between the eyes.

There may be numerous tubercles (a small circular protuberance or spine on the skin or scales) and ridges on the upper areas of the

Much study over many years has been done on this species and also the Squelching Frog (Crinia insignifera) as the two species are known to hybridise.
